

KS1 Hub Curriculum Guide

Here is a short summary of the curriculum your child will be following this half term. You can help by;

- Sharing a book with your child each day
- Helping your child with their learn by heart target and guided reading.
- Speaking to your child about their work and day at school
- Making sure they have the right equipment for school

English	This half term the children in the hub will be reading a fiction story 'Little Red'. They will learn new vocabulary, listen and write the sounds in these new words and sequence the story, the children will use these skills learnt to role play the story. They will create and design different props to accompany their story telling. In speaking and listening they will continue with colourful semantics to help form fluent sentences when speaking. Colourful semantics will also be used to help build sentences when writing simple sentences. The children will continue to write simple sentences and captions for pictures. Our Lego therapy sessions will continue, to help with communication and attention.
Maths	We will be singing number rhymes and practice writing numbers to 20. Children will subitise to 5, continue to carefully count amounts to 10, use money and additon in the 'Café' provision area to allow the children to apply all of their math skills. The children will compare weight, height and length. They will continue, copy and create repeating patterns, make patterns with varying rules and objects and invite children to continue the pattern.
Phonics	In phonics the children are learning phase 3 sounds. We will be using flash cards to remember the tricky words that we will come across in our reading. For letter formation practice we will be practicing the sounds we have learnt that week in our handwriting books each day. Guided Reading sessions are to continue daily. Once a week, a one to one reading session and catch up phonics, to support those needing more practice has been added to our timetable.
Creative Curriculum	This half term's topic is 'School Days'. This project teaches children about their own school and locality, both today and in the past. They compare schooling in the Victorian era to their experiences today. Our trip to Abbey House museum will help bring this learning to life, with a mock Victorian street and a workshop looking at changes through time. We will also have a science project where we explore our five senses. Then at the end of term the children will be designing and making their own sandwich,
Physical Education	In P.E. this half term, children will be developing their hand - eye coordination skills through the introduction to cricket. Children will be developing their fundamental movement skills and gross motor skills through taking part in dodgeball activities. In addition, there will be an intra – school house point dodgeball competition at the end of this half term, to help develop healthy attitudes to winning and losing.
