# **Curriculum Guide**

This term the children will be reading stories and non-fiction texts about famous

Here is a short summary of the curriculum your child will be following this half term. You can help by;

- Sharing a book with your child each day
- Helping your child with their learn by heart target or multiplication tables
- Speaking to your child about their work and day at school
- Making sure they have the right equipment for school
- Use the SAT's practice books for maths and English.

Reading	Kings and Queens, as our topic is called 'Magnificent Monarchs!' We will also read 'The Day the Crayons Quit' and 'Cinnamon'. We will develop the children's retrieval and inference skills. We will also work on sequencing stories and retelling events in the correct order. Emphasis will be placed on children's comprehension skills, both verbally and in written answers.		
Writing	In writing, the children will write a range of non-fiction and descriptive writing. We are continuing to develop key writing skills such as using expanded noun phrases and including connectives to give reasons and develop ideas. Throughout the term, the children will be working on improving their work by editing their sentences after writing. The children will continue to consolidate their spelling, punctuation and grammar skills throughout the term. They will also continue to learn handwriting joins.		
Mathematics	Multiplication facts: 2, 5 and 10 times tables and related division facts Counting in 3s and 4s.	Learn By Heart Targets: Multiplication and division facts for the 2 and 5 times table.	
Creative Curriculum	This term we will be looking at Magnificent Monarchs. This project teaches children about the English and British monarchy from AD 871 to the present day. Children will be using timelines and finding out information about royal palaces and important royal events. They will build up an understanding of the monarchs and how they are important to the United Kingdom. They will also research six of the most significant sovereigns. The children will be encouraged to ask historical questions, give their opinions and justify their reasons.		
Physical Education	In P.E. this half term, children in year 2 will improve their ability to move fluently whilst changing speed and direction. Children will develop skills to enable them to catch and stop a ball, and explore different techniques to throw and hit the ball, showing basic control through cricket. Children will also expand their knowledge of invasion games through the skills need to successfully compete in a dodgeball game. The children will compete in an intra – school house point dodgeball competition at the end of the half term.
