



Curriculum Guide

Here is a short summary of the curriculum your child will be following this half term.
You can help by:

- Sharing a book with your child each day
- Helping your child with their learn by heart target or multiplication tables
- Speaking to your child about their work and day at school
- Making sure they have the right equipment for school
- Checking their homework diary each week

Reading	This term, the children will be preparing for the SATs which will commence on Tuesday 9 th May. They will improve their reading comprehension by reading a range of text types and will work on the more challenging skills of inference, summarizing, finding the meaning of words and discussing the author's choice of language. They will work on applying their comprehension skills to answer the more complex questions which are similar to those on the SATs papers. Children should continue to read and enjoy books at home.	
Writing	In writing this half term, the children will recap all of the Key Stage 2 writing skills which we have worked on this year. They will develop their writing through following the writing process, which requires them to re-draft their work in order to improve and display the skills we have worked on. We will also be revising our knowledge of grammar, punctuation and spelling rules in preparation for the GPS test.	
Mathematics	In maths this half term, we will prepare the children for their tests. We will continue to recap formal methods and develop the children's reasoning skills. The children will continue to improve their speed and accuracy when answering questions.	Learn By Heart Targets: * I can recall prime numbers. * I can recall measurement facts. *I can say how many days are in each month.
Creative Curriculum	In creative curriculum this half term, we will be learning about the causes, events and consequence of the First and Second World Wars, the influence of new inventions on warfare, how life in Great Britain was affected and the legacy of the wars. Inspired by the Make Do and Mend campaign, the children will also make bags from recycled materials using a variety of stitches.	
Physical Education	In P.E. this half term, children in year 6 will learn to perform and combine skills, at speed, with confidence and purpose. The children will start to choose and apply skills that meet the needs of the situation such as retrieving, intercepting, bowling and hitting in the great game of cricket. Year 6 children will also master basic movements, as well as develop balance, agility and coordination through partaking in dodgeball games. The children will compete in an intra - school house point dodgeball competition at the end of half term.
