Shortly we have three members of our support team starting their maternity leaves. We will be recruiting to fill these posts in the near future.


Attendance

Parents Evening Survey Results



Thank you to all the parents and carers who filled in our questionnaire on parents evening. We are always interested in your views and use the results from your survey to help us to improve provision for our children.

98% believe their child is happy at this school

100% believe their children are safe

95% believe the children are well behaved

99% believe their child does well at school

99% would recommend this school to another parent.

There were two issues.

- 1. The SEND guestions are not understood by most parents and therefore do not give us accurate information.
- 2. 10% of parents disagree that bullying is dealt with quickly and effectively and 10% don't know.

As a result of this we have conducted a bullying questionnaire with all children from Y3 to Y6. There were 3 children who said that bullying had continued after it had been dealt with by an adult. All of these cases have now been addressed and resolved.

We are always working hard to deal with any behaviour issues including bullying. Please come and speak with your child's class teacher if you have any concerns.

Healthy Eating



As well as providing free fruit every day for every child, we have been encouraging all the children to eat their vegetables at school.

We are trying to encourage all the children to choose a vegetable that they are happy to eat at lunchtime. Children who bring a packed lunch are also being encouraged to bring a vegetable to eat. This could be a portion of cucumber or some raw carrot sticks.

Please talk to your child about which vegetables they like to eat.

Consultation about the length of the school day

The Government have introduced an expectation that all state funded schools in England will have a 32.5 hour minimum core school week by September 2024.

At Girlington we currently have a 30 hour week, therefore we need to increase our week by 2.5 hours by September this year.

We will be sending out a consultation to parents, staff, pupils and governors so that we can gather your views on this issue.
